24th May 2020 SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER (A)

Dear Friends

Although this Sunday is rather blandly known as the 7th Sunday of Easter, the historical event we recall this weekend was actually a watershed in the story of the early Church and in the life of the Apostles. It was an 'in-between' time. By which I mean that Jesus had ascended back into Heaven. He had asked Peter, James, John and the other Apostles to continue his ministry of healing and mercy. But they felt surrounded by threats and danger and it was for them a time of fear and uncertainty. To carry out Jesus' request they needed to feel the power of his presence, even though they could no longer physically see him. They felt that presence at Pentecost (which we will celebrate next Sunday) when the Holy Spirit came upon them.

I am sure you can see the parallel to our own situation at the moment. We are experiencing an 'in-between' time – lockdown restrictions have been eased a bit but we still do not know how things will work out definitely for the future. But we can take comfort in the fact that the Apostles have been there before us. Praying to the Saints is really like asking help from trusted, old friends. So as we continue to keep our Parish Community together through caring for each other by prayer, thought and action, let us also ask the Apostles to support us and strengthen us at this time.

MARRIAGE MATTERS - SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER: Acts 1:1-11 Ephesians 1:17-23 Matt 28:16-20



'Filled with hope'

Today's readings tell us of the end and the beginning of something new and exciting in the life of the young Church. When we married, we were filled with both excitement and trepidation for our future together.

But like the disciples, the Spirit of the risen Lord has been with us since we became "Little Church" on our wedding day.

READINGS FOR THE SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER:

First Reading

Acts 1:12-14

After Jesus was taken up into heaven the apostles went back from the Mount of Olives, as it is called, to Jerusalem, a short distance away, no more than a sabbath walk; and when they reached the city they went to the upper room where they were staying; there were Peter and John, James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot, and Jude son of James. All these joined in continuous prayer, together with several women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.

Second Reading

1 Peter 4:13-16

If you can have some share in the sufferings of Christ, be glad, because you will enjoy a much greater gladness when his glory is revealed. It is a blessing for you when they insult you for bearing the name of Christ, because it means that you have the Spirit of glory, the Spirit of God resting on you. None of you should ever deserve to suffer for being a murderer, a thief, a criminal or an informer; but if anyone of you should suffer for being a Christian, then he is not to be ashamed of it; he should thank God that he has been called one.

Gospel

John 17:1-11

Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said: 'Father, the hour has come: glorify your Son so that your Son may glorify you; and, through the power over all mankind that you have given him, let him give eternal life to all those you have entrusted to him. And eternal life is this: to know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. I have glorified you on earth and finished the work that you gave me to do. Now, Father, it is time for you to glorify me with that glory I had with you before ever the world was. I have made your name known to the men you took from the world to give me. They were yours and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word.

Now at last they know that all you have given me comes indeed from you; for I have given them the teaching you gave to me, and they have truly accepted this, that I came from you, and have believed that it was you who sent me.

I pray for them;
I am not praying for the world
but for those you have given me,
because they belong to you:
all I have is yours
and all you have is mine,
and in them I am glorified.
I am not in the world any longer,
but they are in the world,
and I am coming to you.'
