

COVID ROADMAP

Canon Christopher Thomas, the General Secretary of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, has sent this guidance to all Parishes on behalf of Cardinal Vincent and all our Bishops.

Looking at the current situation with the omicron variant, it is important to ensure that the points set out below are followed in our churches:

- . That people displaying any symptoms of covid-19 should stay at home. not travel to church or attend in person.
- . That hand sanitiser is available for everyone attending church.
- That there is a strong recommendation for people to wear a face covering (both nose and mouth) during acts of worship.
- . That there is good ventilation and passage of air throughout the church building; in this case, because of climatic conditions, it is important to remind people to wrap up well in church!
- . That a positive message encouraging people to get vaccinated and have the booster jab should be conveyed whenever possible.
- . That people who are engaged in any form of pastoral ministry which involves visiting the sick, housebound or vulnerable should take regular lateral flow tests to ensure they are safe to do so. These tests are free from the NHS.

There is now very strong evidence to support that the main mode of transmission of the virus is through breath and nasal aerosols, and that the risk from surface and touch transmission is very small.

If these guidance points are followed, then our churches will continue to be safe places for people to gather for worship, including during the Christmas period.
