Saturday 6th December / Sunday 7th December 2025 SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT (A)

This week I'm breaking with recent tradition and reflecting on the first reading of this weekend's Mass rather than the Gospel. This passage, from Isaiah (11:1-10), is sometimes referred to as the peaceable kingdom. I remember it quite clearly from when I first began reading here at Mass, and I still find it quite moving. The peace on the holy mountain that Isaiah describes—the wolf dwelling with the lamb, the calf and the lion feeding together, and the child who puts his hand into the viper's nest coming to no harm—gives us such a powerful image. It is an image of God's promise of a world made whole again, where what seems impossible becomes possible. Isaiah also offers us one of the most hope-filled images in all of Scripture: "A shoot shall spring from the stump of Jesse." At first, a stump seems like the end of something, lifeless, cut down, incapable of bearing fruit. Yet it's precisely there, in the place that looks barren, that new life will begin. Isaiah is speaking about the coming Messiah of course, but this image can speak to us personally too. We all have "stumps" in our lives; places that feel exhausted and depleted, but God often begins his most beautiful work in exactly those places. Where we see an ending, God sees the possibility of something new.

So, as we light the second candle of Advent this week, perhaps we can pause and ask: Where do I need God to bring new life? What "shoot" might he be quietly growing in me? Isaiah encourages us not to fear the barrenness we sometimes feel, but to watch for the surprising ways God brings renewal.
